The international jury of the fifth edition of UNESCO-Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Prize for Outstanding Practice and Performance in Enhancing the Effectiveness of Teachers selected three projects that have successfully met the criteria for winning the Prize. Dr. Jamal Al Muhairi, Deputy Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Secretary-General of Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Award for Distinguished Academic Performance said 150 participations applied to the current session of UNESCO-Hamdan Prize, representing educational institutions and initiatives from all continents, which applied to win the prestigious award.

The jury completed the Dubai-based adjudication adjudication process of the projects nominated to win the Prize in its fifth session.

Dr. Al Muhairi stated that after the initial screening, 90 participants qualified, distributed across 33 continents from Asia, 24 from Africa, 24 from South and Central America and 9 from Europe.

"The international jury will submit a report to Audrey Azoulay, Director-General of UNESCO, to approve the results and announce the winners who will be honored on the Teacher's Day on 5th of October at UNESCO headquarters, Paris.'

The number of participants in UNESCO-Hamdan Prize since its inception in 20092010 until the fifth session 2017-2018 amounted to 531, from different continents of the world.

Adjudication Process Luke Ria, Chairman of the international jury of UNESCO-Hamdan Prize explained that the adjudication process had two stages: the preliminary

screening and the final adju-

dication. The initial screening committee consisted of five members, who received the participations from UNESCO to check and review, in order to make sure that the needed requirements are met in the nomination applications.

"The international jury was nominated and selected by the Director-General of UN-ESCO. It consisted of five

members, representing all geographical regions in the world according to the International Classification."

The jury of the current session was formed by a group of international experts in the field of education. Janis Carroll-Lind (Asia and Pacific Representative), is the Director of Research and Postgraduate Programs. Isao Jado (Africa Representative), is a university professor, senior lecturer at CAM universities, professor at the Higher School of Teachers at NATITINGOU (University of Baracoa), as well as former independent consultant to UNESCO (Paris, Dakar), UNICEF (Benin) and to many non-governmental organizations in Benin - South Africa. Jado also works as the Director of Teacher Training College of Primary Schools in Benin, and consultant to special research and the Vocational Development Center for Teachers in Benin.

Among the international jury is Musfir bin Saud bin Abdullah Al Salouli (Representa-tive of the Arab States), Vice Dean of Development and Quality for Develop-ment, Assistant Professor of Mathematics Teaching (King Saud University, College of Education). Denise Vaillant (Representative of Latin America and the Caribbean). She is the Director of the Institute of Education (ORT Uruguay) and President of the Teaching Profession International Observatory (University of Barcelona, Spain). Vaillant has also worked with ministries of education throughout Latin America to implement the policies of teachers and school reform. The fifth member is Luke Ria (Representative of Europe and North America), Professor of Educational Sciences at the French Institute of Education, Lyon, holder of UNESCO Chair in Training





11 Winners in 4 Sessions

The number of winners of UNESCO-Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Prize for Outstanding Practice and Performance in Enhancing the Effectiveness of Teachers since its first session in 2009-2010 until the fourth one in 2015-2016 amounts to 11 winners.

The winners of the first edition 2009-2010 were Ali Foundation for Education, Pakistan; the Center of Excellence for Teacher Training, Dominican; and Congo Center for Education for All, Congo.

The second session 2011-2012 was awarded to the Rato Bangala Foundation, Nepal; the African Institute for Mathematical Sciences Schools Enrichment Centre, South Af-

rica; and the Banco del Libro, Venezuela. In the third session 2013-2014, the winners were Oxfam Novib and Education International for their project: Quality Educators for All: Every Child needs a Good Teacher implemented in Mali and Uganda; ProEd Foundation for its project: Teachers Teaching Teachers – Professional Learning Community (PLC) implemented in Panama; and SOS Children's Village for its project: Teacher Training Program implemented in Madagascar.

While the fourth edition of the Prize 2015-2016 was given to two winners: See Beyond Borders foundation for 'Teach the Teacher' project, Cambodia; University of Malaya – Administration of Mathematical and Educational Sciences in the Faculty of Education for 'Environmental Citizenship Education' project, Malaysia.

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Teachers for the 21st Century, and Academic Officer of the Research and Training Program, which includes about 1,000 videos of junior teachers, along with change samples in their teaching methods based on their successive experiences.

UNESCO-Hamdan for was founded in 2008 as an initiative by Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Award for Distinguished Academic Performance and the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), with the aims of supporting and enhancing the levels of edu-cation and improving the quality of learning, in order to achieve the objectives of Education for All, one of UN-ESCO priorities.

The Prize is awarded biennially for the three winners from around the world who provide outstanding edu-cational practice contributing to improving the performance and effectiveness of teachers all over the world. Supported generously by His Highness Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Deputy Ruler of Dubai and UAE Minister of Finance, the US\$ 300,000 Prize is divided equally on the three winners.

Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Award for Distinguished Academic Performance has completed the final phase of central adjudication of the 20th session, which included conducting personal interviews and carrying out field visits, based on which, the degree of excellence is determined or modified according to the evaluation process. Later on. the winners are decided along with their ranks and positions.

The central adjudication process began at the H Hotel, Dubai, where a meeting was held with jury members. The meeting stressed the Award's aim in establishing impartial transparency in the adjudication process, along with the accuracy of results and credibility in granting the degree of excellence to those who deserve it among the elements of the educational

The adjudication committees

conducted interviews with the participants in Distinguished Student category, in order to ascertain the validity of what has been mentioned in the applications. The committee then carried out field visits for the rest of the categories in each field, such as Distinguished Teacher, Distinguished School, and other categories.

The jury of the 20th session said that some applications did not meet the required level, which means that the applicants have to work harder on avoiding the deficiencies in the coming sessions, noting that commitment to standards and accessing previous winning submissions are key elements to winning the Award.

Participations

Dr. Jamal Al Muhairi, Secretary-General of the Award, said the number of local participations in the 20th sessions amounted to 341, including 4 applications to the Distinguished School category, 260 to Distinguished Student, 33 to Distinguished Educator 19 to Highly Distinguished Teacher, 8 to Best

Scientific Innovation, 4 to Best Implemented Project, 4 to Distinguished Family, One to Distinguished Teacher, and 8 submissions in Education-Supporting Institutions.

On the other hand, 86 applications were submitted from the GCC countries.

Al Muhairi also pointed out that the 20th cycle has witnessed an increase in Educational Research category by 120 per cent, compared to the previous sessions, in addition to 5 submissions among people of determination.

Dr. Al Muhairi further explained that the 20th session has witnessed new developments in the application process for some of its categories this year. One of which is the online submission for 5 categories in the current session as a test phase, namely: Best Implemented Project, Best Scientific Innovation, Education-Supporting Institution, Distinguished Educational Administration, and Distinguished Educator. He also pointed out that this procedure will result in a paradigm shift both in the

concept of application and adjudication.

"There is improvement in Educational Research category in general compared to previous years, after having merged this category among local and Arab world submissions, where the number of submissions has reached 65. Some winners in previous sessions have submitted new researches this year as well, which confirms the importance of the Award."

Stages of Adjudication

Dr. Ali Al Kaabi, Chairman of the Adjudication Committee said that central adjudication goes through two basic stages: theoretical adjudication stage, and field visits along with personal inter-views stage, which is designed for candidates who have obtained certain level of excellence in the first stage. During this stage, the results of the evaluation will be verified, and practical assessment will be carried out taking into consideration the aspects of excellence possessed by the competing candidates in each category. At the end of this stage, candidates are selected for the Award, the Certificate of Excellence, and the Participation Certificate.

Dr. Sultan Al Suwaidi, Chairman of the Adjudication Committee for the Distinquished School / School Administration category said that candidate schools were able to activate and implement creativity and innovation in their processes. He also pointed out that the criteria of the Award made these schools adhere to and seek excellence in every aspect, because they have adopted these standards and criteria as a slogan and a title to their aspirations.

Spirit of Competition

Dr. Ibrahim Yousif, Chairman of the Adjudication Committee for the Distinguished Teacher and Highly Distinguished Teacher category said that the Award criteria have enhanced the spirit of competition in the field of education among







various groups. It also keeps pace with the modern development witnessed by the field of education. He also pointed out that the continuous development of the Award criteria encourages educational excellence, and helps spread the culture of creativity and quality, as well as highlighting the important role of the parties that support the culture of excellence, especially that the Award is characterized with international criteria.

He also mentioned that application of the Teacher category requires four main criteria; namely teaching performance, moral performance, professional development, and the ability to motivate. The Distinguished Teacher candidate has to pass and acquire 750 out of 1000, while Highly Distinguished Teacher should, in addition to that, meet the criteria of creativity and innovation.

Dr. Aousha Al Muhairi, Chairperson of the Adjudication Committee for the Distinguished University Student said the evaluation forms help facilitate the admission process and aid the students through clarifying weaknesses that should be avoided in applications. She also pointed out that the majority of participating students have succeeded in attaching appropriate evidence to the standards of the Award.





















30 candidates to 2nd phase of 'Innovators' competition, results announced soon

Fab Lab UAE, of Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Award for Distinguished Academic Performance, completed the interviews with 30 participants who qualified for the recently launched 'Innovators' competition, marking the end of the second phase of the evaluation.

Marwa Ibrahim Sahrawi, Head of Innovation Department and Director of Fab Lab in the Award said that Innovators competition has witnessed a great turnout, with more than 735 participants from different emirates of the UAE.

She pointed out that the results of the competition are to be announced soon, having in mind that the committee of specialists completed the final phase, in which applicable ideas were evaluated. Personal interviews were conducted for participants with the best ideas, where each participant presented their idea to the evaluation

Evaluation Criteria

Marwa Sahrawi stated that the evaluation process is based on calculating points, where the idea itself is allocated 70 points. The criteria focus not violate regulations, policies and ethics of the United Arab Emirates. The remaining 30 points are allocated to benefit criterion, which focuses on the clarity of the idea and its tangible impact.

committee, explaining the benefits of its application.

'The competition is in line with the Fab Lab UAE's triplicity (Design, Make, Share), and it is considered one of its qualitative initiatives, as the idea is to attract students who have creative tendencies and applicable ideas or even the ones who have a passion for innova-

She further explained that the aim of the competition is to encourage students to think creatively and to provide them with an environment that would help them transform their ideas into reality through Fab Lab UAE. Students participate in this competition with their innovative ideas, and are evaluated by a specialized committee. Later on, Unique ideas are chosen to be realized into a product by Fab Lab UAE.

Incentives and Rewards

Concerning incentives and rewards, Sahrawi said that winning ideas will be rewarded a winning certificate and a reward of AED 5000, distributed as follows: (Three winners of each group, the first group: 5-8 year olds, and the second group: 9-12 year olds). Top 15 distinctive ideas will be awarded a Certificate of Distinguished Idea, and all participants will be awarded a Certificate of Appreciation for participation. She added that winners will have the opportunity to transform winning ideas into prototypes and practical projects through Fab Lab UAE. "The ideas have met the

conditions in terms of being applicable in reality, new and not imitated or attributed to others. The ideas should also not be admitted to previous competitions, are not inconsistent with the regulations, policies and ethics in force in the UAE, and should take into account the country's orientations such as preservation of the environment, rationalization, sustainability, energy, and others.'

20 students were trained at the winter camp of Fab Kids, which was organized by Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Award for Distinguished Academic Performance, in collaboration with the German coach Andreas of Fab Lab Munich. The training included digital programming and manufacturing in order to help them develop their creative thinking abilities and build creative and innovative personalities.

The winter camp targeted students ranging from 6 to 11 years of age, where they were trained by foreign and local experts in digital fabrication, and were able to implement 6 projects.

Marwa Ibrahim, Fab Lab in-charge reassured the Award's relentless keenness on organizing camps that would motivate students, create a supportive environment and establish an innovationstimulating infrastructure that encourages innovative thinking, as well as spreading the culture of innovation and digital fabrication. The Award also seeks to broaden the scope critical thinking among targeted audience in order to be able to turn their ideas into applicable projects, and to nurture outstanding individuals, as well as to train the staff and pioneers of Fab

She also said that the winter camp is aimed at directing students to use modern technology in what is beneficial to them and their communities. as well as building creative and innovative personalities that would help them attain the higher ranks in their fields. The camp also focuses on implementing the seed of innovation in children at an early age, in addition to motivating children to work both individually and within groups.

Motivation
