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Innovation .. The Post-Showcase Phase




- Perhaps one of the most prominent events held during the UAE Innovation Month is the Dubai Maker Faire 2019, which the Hamdan bin Rashid AI Maktoum Foundation for Distinguished Academic Performance is credited for its ability to attract it to the UAE, being one of the most important international exhibitions on innovation around the world. The Faire also catches the eyes and participation of a wide range of innovators and manufacturers, as well as companies and educational institutions.
- The Dubai Maker Faire was characterized by its excellent organization, good participation rate, and high level of attendance. Under its roof, 150 platforms gathered, containing innovative ideas, products, and factories that expressed their need for these kinds of exhibitions, in search of opportunities and deals that move from the state of idea and model to the state of production, marketing, and usage.
- The Faire, which was visited by nearly 12,000 visitors over three days, has shown the students' interest in innovation and their passion for applying their knowledge and skills in reality, which confirms the presence of great innovative student energies that lie behind the classroom or at home workshops. These energies are longing to jump out of the box of theoretical knowledge and traditional activities to the reality of challenge and practical achievement.
- It can be said that the Faire succeeded in laying the first building blocks for national innovations, especially those of students. Beyond the praise and compliment to the Faire given by officials and visitors, the promotion of the innovation culture and the need to root it in the fabric of the education process, from home to school and work environments, have become among the most important matters that the community must work on.
- The other topic, which must be given more attention, is to provide the elements of success for the exhibitions of manufacturers and innovators, due to their practical results and cultural, economic value, not the results of showcasing and media. This will only be achieved through the methodization of content, techniques, tools, and legislations. It also needs finding partnership with economic and commercial sectors, with the aim of supporting innovators, providing care for them, ensuring their assistance in patenting and feasibility studies, and transforming their innovations into products and services.
- With his usual frankness, His Highness Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Deputy Ruler of Dubai, Minister of Finance, and President of the Foundation, pointed out, in an interview with Dubai TV, after the opening of the Faire, that the innovation sector in the country needs institutional support from the concerned ministries and authorities. He stated that Hamdan Foundation's initiatives in the field of innovation will be assessed in order to be optimize their utilization in serving innovators, especially our sons and daughters -- the students.
- It is certainly a direct hint that we need to go beyond the phase of dazzling showcasing to the phase of contracting, production, marketing, and constituting an addition to the value of the national economy and society -- this is the expected outcome of our efforts.





Honoring Speakers, Arbitration Members and Winners of "Innovators" Competition






On the sideline, the Faire organized a number of entertainment and cultural competitions for school students, which were well received and widely popular among attend-

Each of these workshops were dedicated to specific fields of knowledge, some of which contained in its content live presentations of creations characterized with ancient heritage roots, and others that keep abreast of modern age developments.

In the field of folklore manufacturing, a variety of popular crafts workshops was organized, including Embroidery, Talli, wickerwork and perfumery. The Faire also included workshops on the latest developments in technology, which included robotics programming, recycling, and many other creations in the field of technological development and innovation. A Kufi Calligraphy Workshop was also held with the aim of promoting Arabic identity, as it is considered one of the most distinguished and famous Arabic fonts.



A number of prominent figures from the public and private sectors on both the local and international levels have participated in Maker Faire Dubai 2019 along with many innovators, specialists, experts and artists in the field of innovation and creativity from around the world. During his speech at the Faire, His Excellency Lieutenant General Dhahi Khalfan Tamim. Deputy Chief of Police and Public Security in Dubai, spoke about the UAE's adoption of a national strategy that focuses on supporting innovation and nurturing talented and creative people through two main paths, namely the governmental and the civil ones.

His Excellency also highlighted the Government's utilization of all efforts to support innovation financially and morally, saying: "The UAE Government constantly works on harnessing all potentials and capabilities to

established special councils dedicated to young scientists, and has allocated funds to support innovation.

Huda Al Hashimi, Assistant Director General for Strategy and Innovation at the Office of the






Prime Minister at the Ministry of Cabinet Affairs and Future, spoke about the difference between the concepts of innovation and invention. She also reviewed some of the common misconceptions about innovation saying: "The common misconception that innovation is linked to pure talent, without the need for skill or practice is not true. Innovation is not limited to a group of talented people and geniuses. Innovation is more like a muscle that needs to be constantly trained in order to grow. This means that anybody can become innovative after receiving the right training and good amount of practice."

Skills Employment

Dr. Abdul Latif Al Shamsi, Director of the Higher Colleges of Technology, stressed that the future is for those who possess the skills and talents rather than academic certificates. He added that many of the world's institutions have already started employing those with the skills and talents without the need for certification, such as Apple, Google and IBM. Al Shamsi also said that we are facing future challenges imposed by the Fourth Industrial Revolution and the successive changes in the labor market, which in turn requires higher education institutions to develop their visions and strategic plans with the aim of enabling students to acquire more skills and help them improve in the field of research and innovation.

Ahmad Al Saleh, Co-founder of Ebot system and producer of maker Faire Kuwait addressed, in his speech, the methods of achieving economic sustainability through innovation. He also pointed out that economy is a combination of several inputs, namely, knowledge, innovation and skill acquisition, and that education shapes our way of thinking and drives us towards innovation and creativity.



Niti Parikh, designer, maker and leader in "The Maker LAB" at Cornell Tech, with more than 12 years of expe-rience in the field of interior architecture and sustainable manufacturing presented a lecture titled "Expanding the Horizons of Research and its Impact Through Design," which addressed how to focus on sustainable practices

in public places.

She also talked about her work experience in the Gulf Region, as she has been living there since 2008, and founded her design studio (NPS), which utilizes modern handicrafts in order to solve small and large design problems.

A special video conference was organized with NASA's former astronaut, Catherine (Cady) Coleman, with the help and support of United States Consulate General and its educational center

"EducationUSA", which participated in the Faire through a unique pavilion.

Throughout her 24-year career with NASA, Coleman registered more than 4,330 hours in space on the Space Shuttle Columbia and the International Space Station. Coleman expressed her delight to share her experience with the attendees and participants of "Maker Faire Dubai 2019."

Three teams from the universities of Dubai, Abu Dhabi and Rochester won the "Hackathon Maker Faire Dubai," which is a competition organized by the Ham-dan bin Rashid Al Maktoum Foundation for Distinguished Academic Performance throughout the days of the International "Maker Faire Dubai 2019." In the Hackathon, a number of student from UAE universities formed teams, in order to work together to find practical innovative solutions to various challenges.

The number of participating teams reached 8, consisting of 34 participant from different UAE universities: University of Dubai, Abu Dhabi University, Rochester Institute of Technology in Dubai, Abu



Dhabi Polytechnic and Higher Colleges of Technology. The participants applied in-

The participants applied innovative ideas presented by creative children aged 5 to 12, and turned them into reality and actual products and projects, using digital fabrication tools and devices. This was carried out under the supervision and evaluation of technical specialists and an arbitration committee, which included a number of experts from various fields.

During the closing ceremony of the Faire, the winners were announced and honored. The first prize amounted to AED 20,000 went to University of Dubai's Team, namely: Humaid Abdullah Al Mar-

zouqi, Abdul Rahman Saleh Al Abdouli, Abdullah Othman Al Marzouqi, Omar Yousuf Al Zarouni, and Basma Sammour

The second place, with a prize of AED 10,000, went to Abu Dhabi University's Team, namely: Suha Hasan Siddiqi, Aisha Mohammed, and Reem Abdullah Hamad.




The Takaful Fund is a plat-

Preventing Waste of Money

The fund is specialized in meeting the social and financial needs of the members. The Takaful Fund Committee also saves the funds from loss or waste, deposits them in an Islamic bank and invests them in a legitimate manner.

The number of beneficiaries of the Takaful Fund in the IACAD reached 532 in 2018. This information was announced during the meeting, explaining that the main objective of the Fund is to serve the largest number possible of over 1000 employees currently working at the IACAD. These services aim at bringing happiness and motivating the IACAD's employees, which will in turn reflect positively on the level of performance and increase productivity at the workplace. 
